President Ronald Reagan (1982):

“We recognize the right of the Puerto Rican people to self-determination... this administration will accept whatever choice is made by a majority... In statehood, the language and culture of the island – rich in history and tradition – would be respected, for in the United States the cultures of the world live together with pride.”

President George H.W. Bush:

(1989): “I’ve long believed that the people of Puerto Rico should have the right to determine their own political future. Personally, I strongly favor statehood. But I urge the Congress to take the necessary steps to allow the people to decide in a referendum.”

(2007): “Puerto Ricans have fought bravely in all of America’s wars in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. This patriotic service and sacrifice of Americans from Puerto Rico touched me all the more deeply for the very fact that they have served with such devotion even while denied a vote for the president and members of Congress who determine when, where, and how they are asked to defend our freedoms.”



Rafael Martínez Nadal, Leader of the Statehood Movement:



As long as Puerto Rico is not a State, however, the will of its people regarding their political status should be ascertained by means of a general right of referendum or specific referenda sponsored by the U.S.”
